
#### Anti-bullying ambassadors

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# BT Young Scientist & Technology Exhibition

We were delighted to have two projects accepted to the BT Young Scientist & Technology Exhibition this year. The projects were carried out by 2<sup>nd</sup> Year students Jack Georgieff (B1), Ryan O'Carroll (B1), Joe O'Driscoll, Ryan Noronha (B2) and Elvis Cooney (B2) with their teacher Ms. Duffy. Elvis Cooney has written the following account of his experience at the exhibition.

"This year, along with five other 2<sup>nd</sup> Years, I represented the school in the BT Young Scientist and Technology Exhibition 2016. Only two of the ten projects submitted by our school were chosen to participate in the exhibition. I was really happy when I found out that one of the two chosen was mine. My friend Jack Georgieff, also in 2<sup>nd</sup> Year, and I had been working since September on the project. It was a lot of work but the end result was definitely worth it.

The actual exhibition was huge. There were 2,500 projects submitted to the exhibition with only 550 accepted to participate - that's about 12,000 exhibiting students. Our project was entitled 'Exploring the Human Energy Field'. The main hypothesis was that there is a field of electromagnetic vibration extending around the human body, and that it can be affected by positive and negative influences. For example, if you were feeling sad or lonely, the energy field around your body would get smaller and emit weaker magnetic radiation, but if you were feeling happy or excited, your energy field would get bigger and emit stronger magnetic radiation.

A lot of people were very interested in our project. Unfortunately, we didn't win any prizes in the end but the experience was definitely worth it. During the exhibition we were judged three times by the Young Scientist Judges as they tried to decide who might be contenders for a prize.

There were lots of amazing people at the exhibition. We met Stephen Byrne from RTE, and Tony Scott, the founder of the exhibition. There were also a lot of media representatives. We had our picture published in two newspapers and I found myself on the RTE Six O'Clock News.



There were projects from all over the country and we made lots of friends among the other exhibitors. The projects we could see were from a variety of different areas, each one unique; from self-driving cars, to the mathematical algorithm of coffee rust, to the effect of the lunar cycle on horses foaling, to the hidden dangers of high heels. The exhibition was open to the public for three very busy days. Apart from the students' exhibitions there was also an Industries Hall where different corporations exhibited their newest advances in technology and science."

1<sup>st</sup> Year Soccer

On 11<sup>th</sup> January, our 1<sup>st</sup> Year Soccer Team played a league match against **St. MacDara's Community College** on the Peamount AstroTurf pitch. Unfortunately, the game ended in a 3-2 defeat.

Clonkeen took the lead very early on with a goal from Mark Ivie (A3). MacDara's struck back, equalising in the 12<sup>th</sup> minute with a devastating counter attack which followed our corner. Just before half-time, MacDara's took the lead with a terrific strike. Our brave goalkeeper, Jack Jenkinson, could do nothing about it, despite his valiant effort.

The second half began and the game was tight. To the delight of our coaches, Mark Ivie (A3) equalised to make it 2-2. He showed beautiful skill with a deft chip over their goalkeeper from just inside the box.

With about 15 minutes to go, MacDara's struck the final blow. They comfortably dispatched a penalty to make it 3-2, and soon after the final whistle was blown. Nonetheless, the spirit of the Clonkeen players throughout the game was highly commendable.

On 15<sup>th</sup> January, the team prepared to play their penultimate league match against **St. Benildus College**, in a group which also included Oatlands and MacDara's. The game was played on the Benildus AstroTurf pitch and ended in a close 2-2 draw. This was the final league game for our boys who unfortunately did not manage to progress beyond the group stage of the competition this year.



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Although, out of the league the 1<sup>st</sup> Year boys still had hopes of progression in the cup. They played their last 16 match against **Drimnagh Castle Secondary School** on Tuesday, 26<sup>th</sup> January. The league final was played on 28<sup>th</sup> January against **St. Mark's Community School**, Tallaght. The sides were very evenly matched. Clonkeen showed tenacity and skill and were unlucky to find themselves a goal down at the break. Both teams came back even stronger in the second half, in what was a tense 40 minutes. St. Mark's managed to sneak a goal in past our goalkeeper and we were terribly unlucky not to be able to come back. The boys and their coaches Mr. Cassidy and Mr. Kelly were very disappointed to come away with a loss in the final, but they look forward to their next cup match and to the Dublin Cup competition.
