

Literacy News: Wellread National Award

The PDST 'Wellread National Award' is a national initiative designed and organised by the Professional Development Service for Teachers (PDST). It aims to create heightened awareness about the importance of creating a positive culture of reading in school communities for our young people as part of their personal and academic development. The PDST 'Wellread National Award' is an initiative

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that seeks to involve all relevant stakeholders who impact on student learning including students, teachers, ancillary staff, parents and wider community in a range of reading and associated activities. It is envisaged that a national award will explicitly foster and nurture a reading culture in schools.

From 2016-2017, Ms Healy established a library committee with the support of Mr Toomey at Clonkeen College, to initiate our school's application process for the PDST 'Wellread National Award'. Our entire school community has been invested in the process, our students, staff, parents and management along with our community links worked together to create activities and initiatives to promote and foster a love of reading. "Reading for Pleasure" was established in 2015 and Drop Everything and Read was embraced by staff. Ms O'Rourke supported and supervised during lunchtime Reading Clubs. A Wellread wall displayed our student reviews and student selected list of favourite authors. Many activities were organised in school - from attending the Poetry Day celebrations at the Lexicon, Junior and Senior Book Clubs, Creative Writing Clubs, Oral Literacy with our Debating Club, Parent-Teacher Reading Clubs - as well as linked initiatives to foster a love of reading

outside the classroom. All our efforts were compiled in an online portfolio and our journey was documented on camera by Tom Wallace, this was submitted to the PDST in May 2016.



It was with great pride and pleasure that our Principal Mr Melly and Ms Healy accompanied students: Sean Nolan, Finn McGrath, Shane O'Sullivan and Tom Wallace to the Wellread National Awards on October 12th in Citywest Hotel. Our school was one of thirty nationally to be awarded for our work in improving literacy and fostering a love of reading. Clonkeen College received a certificate and an engraved award in acknowledgement of our literacy efforts.

We would like to take the opportunity to thank our Parents' Association, The Board of Management, our Principal and Deputy Principal our caretakers and our students and staff for their ongoing support and tireless work towards the creation of our school library.

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
Science Week
