
ROC Protection

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BT Young Scientist

& Technology Exhibition 2017

The annual BT Young Scientist and Technology Exhibition took place in the RDS from 11th to 14th January. Clonkeen College was represented by a team comprising Transition Year students Lucas Carraher, Ruairí Greene and Seán Nolan. Ruairí has written the following account of their experience at the exhibition:



Project Overview

Our project involved studying negativity bias in Irish Secondary School students. Negativity bias is a psychological hypothesis that states that all humans and animals have a general bias towards negative news. This means that when given two pieces of news, one positive and one negative, of equal intensity or seriousness that your brain will focus on the negative or will give more weight to the negative news. We were looking to see if this was true in Irish Secondary School students. To date there has not been a study of negativity bias in teenagers. In order to collect the data we required we prepared a survey that we distributed in our boys' school, in a mixed school and in a girls' school. The results were very interesting.

Experience at the Exhibition



The Young Scientist & Technology Exhibition was a great experience. It is a fantastic way to engage more people in Science and it allowed us to see many amazing and inspiring ideas. It was great to meet link-minded students, and, through our discussions find ideas that might become potential projects for next year! Harmony Program Visit

On January 31st and February 1st, Mr Roger Mehta, from The Harmony Program, visited the school to speak with Transition Year students about drug and alcohol misuse and addiction. During the workshop Mr Mehta, engaged the students through the use of music, facilitating discussion and appreciation of the subject. In particular, students focused on the connection between mental health and substance misuse, the impact of these substances and the developing teenage brain and understanding the underlying cases that lead to the misuse of alcohol and drugs. In the latter part of the workshop Mr Mehta taught techniques to combat peer pressure in the area of drug and alcohol use. Students also considered the actions they can take in their own lives to promote positive wellbeing. It was an extremely worthwhile experience for all students involved. Tall Ships Race 2017

Congratulations to Transition Year student, Oisín Cullen, who will participate in the Tall Ships Race 2017. Having achieved the Armory Award and Royal Yachting Association Competent Crew Certificate in October of last year, alongside fellow Clonkeen TY student, Thomas Claffey, Oisín applied for a berth on the Rendezvous Tall Shops Voyage 2017. Before Christmas, Oisín received the thrilling news that he had been selected to participate in Leg 1: Greenwich, London to Sines, Portugal.

Oisín will travel to Southampton, England in February and March for crew training, before setting off from London on April 8th for the eight day voyage to Sines. On the ships' arrival in Sines there will be a three day festival during which the crew changeover will take place before the ship continues on to Leg 2 which will see it cross the Atlantic to Bermuda. Other stages see the ship travel to Boston, a number of ports in Canada and France. The race will finish in France in September.

This is a great opportunity for Oisín to learn and practice life skills, co-operation, and team building. He is required to undertake substantial fundraising in preparation for his voyage. Oisín got straight to work on this before Christmas but still has some distance to go.

We are proud of both Oisín and Thomas's achievements to date, and we wish the best of luck to Oisín on his adventure of a life-time.

Internet Safety Talk

Ms Ursula Frawley from Zeeko, visited the school on 30th January to deliver a workshop on Internet Safety to our 1st Year students. The workshop encouraged students to examine their online activities and to consider their personal safety with regard to this.

They explored the question of appropriate Internet usage and reflected on their legal and social responsibilities as users of the Internet.

Each student will receive a book pack and will complete a review when he has read the book. In addition to the time allocated during the school day, it is hoped that students will choose to read in their own personal time at home. When they have finished reading one text, students may choose another from the ninety-four titles available.



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Green Schools News

DLR Eco Conference

On Tuesday 10th January, students from both the Green Schools committee, and Ms. Evers-Nolan's Transition Year Science Class, attended the 8th Annual Eco Conference, in Dún Laoghaire Town Hall. We were welcomed by Dean Eaton (Acting Environmental Awareness Officer for DLR County Council), and Cllr. Cormac Devlin (An Cathaoirleach (Chairperson) of DLR County Council).



Our first workshop of the day involved planning a three course dinner using ingredients shown on cards. The key focus of this activity was to create healthy, balanced meals, while remaining conscious of the importance of keeping food miles to a minimum.

During the break which followed our first workshop, those who had brought lunch to the conference using only reusable packaging were rewarded with a pencil case full of stationery that was made using only recycled materials from sustainable sources.

Following the break, everyone met in the Council Chamber, and two groups of students from Ballinteer Community School talked about environmental projects they are undertaking through microcompanies they have set up. Next, Ji Hyun Kim (ECO-Unesco), and Claire McDonald (An Taisce - Water) talked about the organizations which they represent and what those organisations are doing at the moment.

For the final activity each table was assigned a country and had to compete in trade against the other represented countries. The winner would be the table with the most Dún Laoghaire Dollars. Students earned these dollars by selling clean-cut and precise shapes they had cut out from paper. However, poorer countries started off with less resources, such as less money, blunt pencils and no scissors, while the wealthy countries had more money and better equipment. Through this activity we gained an understanding of how wealthy countries often stay wealthy, while the poor ones stay poor.



We had an enjoyable an informative day at the Eco Conference. Thank you to Ms Evers-Nolan who organised our attendance at the conference and accompanied us on the day.



Our Third World Support Group has been very busy over the Christmas period.

We had a fantastic response to our call for items for the annual collection for the Saint Vincent de Paul. We managed to fill 25 hampers which were subsequently distributed by the SVP to those most in need in the area. A big 'thank-you' to all who sent in items to the school and also to the Transition Year students who helped prepare the hampers.

In total we have managed to raise the impressive sum of almost €6000, as a result of our Christmas fundraising efforts. A non-uniform day on December 6th netted €774.50. On December 14th, we made €1,468.24 from a bag pack in SuperValu Deansgrange. Christmas Collections in Dun Laoghaire and Blackrock earned €976.46. We also had a successful bag pack in SuperValu Killiney on 24th January, which raised €1,302.53. To date our Christmas Fast has raised €1,200.

As always we have to extend a most sincere thank you to pupils, their families, the local community and local businesses, without whom none of this would be possible. Our efforts over the Christmas period bring us increasingly nearer to the €30,000 that we hope to raise in order to fund the construction of a new primary school in Malawi.
