Physics Teacher of the Year



Congratulations to Ms Máire Duffy, who is the recipient of the annual Institute of Physics, Teacher of Physics Award. This prestigious award honours and rewards the work, of individuals and teams, that contributes to the teaching and learning of physics. This year Ms Duffy was one of six teachers from the United Kingdom and Ireland, and the only Irish teacher, to be recognised for excellence in the teaching of Physics. The award, which is in its 30th year, has only ever been bestowed on seventeen Irish teachers. It is a great honour for Ms Duffy and her work here at Clonkeen College to be acknowledged in this way. Ms Duffy travelled to the Institute of Physics in London to receive her award at the end of November. We are immensely proud of her achievement.

CanSat

Hello everyone! Eight students from 4th to 6th Year have entered the CanSat competition, which is run by the European Space Education Resource Office (ESERO) on behalf of the European Space Agency (ESA), Cork Electronic Industries Association, and the Dublin Institute of Technology (for projects in this region of Ireland). The Clonkeen students participating in the competition are Alexander Cregan, Devon Keogh, Guy Keogh, Joe Clarke, Kevin Nolan, Lucas Carraher and Caolan Moore (support).



For the competition, we must build a mini-satellite inside a container the size of a soft-drinks can. The CanSat will be ejected from a rocket mid-flight and must collect and transmit data to an earth-based computer. We must ensure that the CanSat has a reliable power source and sensors to record the data accurately and program it to transmit the data while in-flight. The data will be both analysed and graphed as it is received. As the CanSat will need to land safely with minimal damage, we plan to equip it with a parachute to ensure a gentle landing.

The regional competition for Dublin will take place on 22nd March and the winners from each region will participate in the CanSat National Final on 27th and 28th April in Co. Laois. The National Winners will go on to represent Ireland in the European CanSat competition in June 2017.



The hurlers did us all proud with two great performances in a week: an excellent semi-final win on the Tuesday over St. Declans CBS, before succumbing to a 3-15 to 3-12 defeat against a very good St. Fintan's High School at a freezing cold Abbottstown on the last Friday in November.



St Fintan's got off to a lightning start, racking up 3-02 in the first 11 minutes, leaving the score at 3-02 to 0-02. No fault to the back line, with Cormac Spain continuing his fine form in goal as he had shown the previous Tuesday. The third goal was the last he'd let in. In a master-stroke from Messrs O'Brien and Bennett, Cian Rellis was pulled back from full-forward to left-half back – a position he also graced with distinction in the semi-final. It was not to be Northern Ireland's day, however, and the Republic of Ireland came away with a 2-1 win.

The Republic of Ireland's toughest challenge was yet to come as they were to face the undefeated hosts Scotland in the final match of the tournament. Jason was back in the team for this pivotal match. The first half was very tense with not many threats at goal. Ireland's first goal came in the 53rd minute when Jason played a beautiful over the top ball for the Irish striker to run in and grab an easy goal. We then took control of the game with two more goals in the 54th minute and the 61st minute. The 3-0 victory saw the Republic of Ireland brig the Victory Shield home to Dublin, for the first time ever.
