Quarter Final Match Report

Topic - Clonkeen College vs. Mountrath Community College

Location – Kilbogget Park, Cabinteely.

Date – 31st January 2022

The team arrived at 11.30 a.m. to their adopted home ground of Kilbogget Park, home of Seapoint Rugby Club. The extended squad of 27 players, many of whom play or have played for Seapoint RFC, prepared for the encounter by being put through their paces on the pitch in the warmup before the game started.

The match began with out-half Rory O'Kane kicking off into a strong head wind which would prove to be a decisive factor later in the match. Our own kick-off was caught by captain Andrew O'Donovan and this set the tone for the team for the rest of the afternoon. Mountrath Community College, having travelled from County Laois, soon settled into the game and took the lead halfway through the first half with an unconverted try to lead 0-5. Clonkeen's backs were against the wall and did well to weather the storm but conceded another try just before half time to go in at the break 0-12 down. Despite the score line the home team were still very much in the game.

At the half time interval, the players refuelled and made light work of the Jaffa Cakes that were provided by the coaching team. After a rousing half time talk by coach Conor Ryan, the second half began. This time Clonkeen College players were playing with the wind at their backs.

An early try was scored by the home team to pull the score line back to 7-12. Soon after, a penalty in front of the sticks was conceded by Mountrath and was duly converted by O'Kane to make it a 2 point game with 20 minutes to go in the second half. The Clonkeen supporters' belief on the sideline, began to grow.

Mountrath then surged up the field to score a try of their own against the run of play which was converted which made it 10-19. From the kickoff, the ball was sent high up into the air and was knocked on giving Clonkeen an attacking scrum 5 meters out from the Mountrath try line. Off the resulting scrum, Jamie Maguire barrelled over the line just to the left of the posts and the kick was converted to make it 17-19 with only minutes left.

One final effort was needed and that was exactly what the Clonkeen supporters got. Clonkeen to
